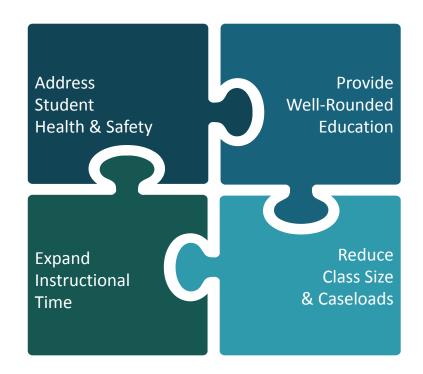

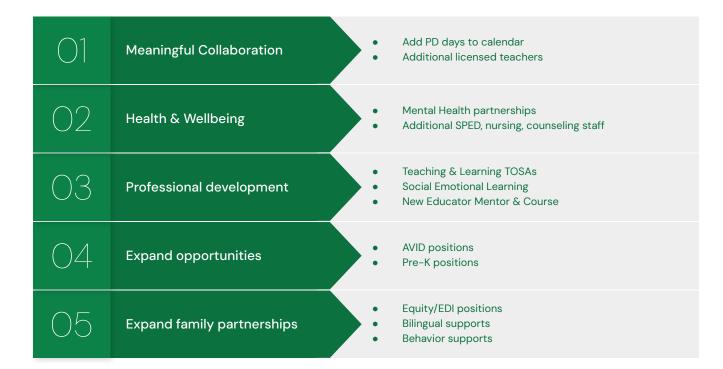
## PURPOSE & INVESTMENTS

## ODE stated purpose for the Student Investment Account:

- 1. Meet students' mental or behavioral health needs
- 2. Increase academic achievement for students, including reducing academic disparities for:
  - a. Economically disadvantaged
  - b. Racial or ethnic groups that have historically experienced academic disparities
  - c. Disabilities
  - d. English language learners
  - e. Foster children
  - f. Homelessness
  - g. Other student groups that have historically experience academic disparities
