


CLASS SIZE



ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE




ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION







